- medical gaze
- benefits and control
- goal: assimilation

- environmental/attitudinal barriers
- discrimination
- lived experiences
- rights and full participation
- goal: social change

Common representations on disability

- medical gaze
- othering
- inspiration porn ("despite…")
- pity ("suffering from…", "bound to a wheelchair")

Ableism

- more than derigatory terms/slurs and explicit discrimination
- structural form of oppression (like sexism, racism...)
- defined by a set of normative ideas, practices, institutions etc.
- normalizing/othering certain types of bodies and behaviours
- resulting in a hierarchy of abilities (closely linked to neoliberal ideas of productivity)
- Closely tied to capitalsm, racism, eugenics...
 - → Can you think of examples of ableism within the field of dance and performance?

Nondisabled Privileges

- unearned advantages (you didn't have to fight for them)
- enable you to gain more privileges
 (e.g. in terms of education and cultural capital)
- often taken-for-granted (and therefore invisible)
 - → Can you think of examples of privileges you have (in relation to disability)?

Aesthetics of Access

- term coined by the Graeae Theatre Company (UK)
- Accessibility as an integral part of the artistic process
- In contrast to "retrofitting": adding accessibility after without taking it into account in the development of the artistic work
- With the artistic lead or involvement of disabled artists/experts
